

2009 MEMBERSHIP

The Annual Happy Heart Farm Membership Fee is used for ongoing capital expenses, like equipment and greenhouses. It is your financial support of the Happy Heart Farm. It is a separate, nonrefundable fee. Receipt of your Membership Fee holds your space for the Summer Vegetable Share, Working Member Share, Split Share, and all Additional Shares.

SUMMER VEGETABLE SHARE

The Full Share (satisfies 2 adults) is a weekly pickup of a share from May to November.

The veggie share fee is due by the first pick-up in late May. If you can pay this in advance, kindly do so.

WORKING MEMBER SHARE

A Working Member's Share requires a commitment of 3 hours per week throughout our planting and harvesting schedule (March-November). A discount is applied from the full share price. There is a limited number of working member shares each year. If you are interested in the Working Membership Share please speak with Dennis immediately.

SPLIT SHARE

If you are planning to split a share with a friend or a neighbor, please have one person responsible for payment. HHF needs the email addresses of both parties. Each party is responsible for the Annual Membership Fee.

ADDITIONAL SHARES

These shares are an extra cost to the summer vegetable shares and prices will be posted on our website in May.

MUSHROOM SHARE

Offered by Hazell Dell Mushrooms. Varieties include button, oyster, shiitake, portabella and lion's mane. 6 weeks (fall).

FRUIT SHARE

Offered by Ela Family Farms in Paonia. Includes peaches, pears, plums and apples. 11 weeks. Approximately 47 pounds of fruit.

JUICE SHARE

Offered by Big B's Orchards in Paonia. A variety of apple juice blends with apricot, pear, cherry, ginger, and apple cider. 6 weeks (fall).

HONEY SHARE

Local delicious organic honey offered by several beekeepers from the Northern Colorado Beekeepers Association. Sizes include: Honey Bears, Pints, and Quarts. Available in late summer.

BERRY SHARE

Raspberries, strawberries, and blackberries. Grown by Garden Sweet in Fort Collins. 6 Weeks (fall)

EGG SHARE

Organic eggs grown by Stan Wamhoff, our neighbor and tractor repair man. Delicious eggs with large yolks and colored shells!

RAW MILK SHARE

Enjoy the best tasting milk with the cream still on top! Available as cow shares offered by Lugene Sass at N. Taft Hill Dairy.

WHAT'S IN A VEGETABLE SHARE?

SPRING distributions provide abundant colorful lettuces, spinach, mixed greens and radishes.

MID SUMMER distributions include fresh basil, summer squash, cucumbers, cauliflower, tomatoes, peppers, melon, and corn.

FALL harvests include winter squash, pie pumpkins, carrots, beets, broccoli, napa cabbage, spinach, and kohlrabi.
